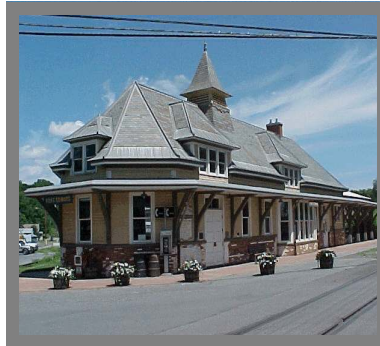


Broadway Pedestrian Rediscovery Project

Village of Fort Edward, New York

The Village lacks continuous sidewalks and street lighting connecting its historic Amtrak Station on East Street to the Broadway (NYS Route 4) business district, and there are also no safe pedestrian facilities linking the Yacht Basin along the Champlain Canal to Broadway, discouraging residents and tourists from accessing the downtown from either of these gateway facilities.

The Village has received funding from the NYS Department of Transportation through the Transportation Enhancements Program to design and construct new pedestrian facilities to connect the train station and the Yacht Basin to Broadway and provide residents and visitors with a designated pathway into the downtown business district.



The project includes the following activities, beginning in the summer of 2007:

- ▶ Design and construct 3,500 feet of new concrete sidewalks and related improvements (curbing, crosswalks) on both sides of East Street from Broadway to the Amtrak train station.
- ▶ Install period-style street lights along East Street adjacent to the new sidewalk.
- ▶ Construct sidewalks and install period-style street lights west from Broadway along Terminal Lane to the Fort Edward Yacht Basin and Underwood Park.
